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General Approach

The aim of this Internet Acceptable Use Policy (AUP) is to ensure that pupils will benefit from the learning opportunities offered by the school's internet resources in a safe and effective manner. Internet use and access is considered a school resource and privilege. If the school AUP is not adhered to this privilege may be withdrawn and appropriate sanctions will be imposed.

When using the internet pupils, parents and staff are expected:

- To treat others with respect at all times.
- Not undertake any actions that may bring the school into disrepute.
- Respect the right to privacy of all other members of the school community.
- Respect copyright and acknowledge creators when using online content and resources.

This Acceptable Use Policy applies to pupils who have access to and are users of the internet in Tirelton National School.

- It also applies to members of staff, volunteers, parents, carers and others who access the internet in Tirelton National School.

Misuse of the internet may result in disciplinary action, including written warnings, withdrawal of access privileges, detention and, in extreme cases, suspension or expulsion. The school also reserves the right to report any illegal activities to the appropriate authorities.

Tirelton National School will deal with incidents that take place outside the school that impact on the wellbeing of pupils or staff under this policy and associated codes of behaviour and anti-bullying policies. In such cases Tirelton National School will, where known, inform parents/carers of incidents of inappropriate online behaviour that take place out of school and impose the appropriate sanctions.

Tirelton National School implements the following strategies on promoting safer use of the internet:

- Pupils will be provided with education in the area of internet safety as part of our implementation of the SPHE curriculum.
- Internet safety advice and support opportunities are provided to pupils in Tirelton National School through our SPHE Curriculum and Internet Safety workshops.
- Teachers will be provided with continuing professional development opportunities in the area of internet safety.
- Tirelton National School participates in Safer Internet Day activities to promote safer more effective use of the internet.

This policy and its implementation will be reviewed annually by the following stakeholders:

- Board of Management, teaching staff, and support staff.

The school will monitor the impact of the policy using:

Should serious online safety incidents take place, the class teacher should be informed. If necessary, then the Principal may be informed.

The implementation of this Internet Acceptable Use policy will be monitored by the teaching and support staff of the school.

Content Filtering

Tirelton National School has chosen to implement the following level on content filtering on the Schools Broadband Network:

- Level 4: This level allows access to millions of websites including games and YouTube but blocks access to websites belonging to the personal websites category and websites such as Facebook belonging to the Social Networking category.

Pupils taking steps to by-pass the content filter by using proxy sites or other means may be subject to disciplinary action, including written warnings, withdrawal of access privileges, detention and, in extreme cases, suspension or expulsion.

Web Browsing and Downloading

Pupils will not intentionally visit internet sites that contain obscene, illegal, hateful or otherwise objectionable materials.

Pupils will report accidental accessing of inappropriate materials in the classroom to their teacher.

Pupils will report accidental accessing of inappropriate materials in school but outside the classroom to their class teacher.

Pupils and staff will not copy information from the internet without acknowledging the creator and referencing the source of the content.

Pupils and staff will be aware that any usage, including distributing or receiving information, school-related or personal, may be monitored for unusual activity, security and/or network management reasons.

Pupils will use the school's internet connection only for educational and career development activities.

Pupils will not engage in online activities such as uploading or downloading large files that result in heavy network traffic which impairs the service for other internet users.

Pupils will not download or view any material that is illegal, obscene, and defamatory or that is intended to annoy or intimidate another person.

- Use of file sharing and torrent sites is allowed with staff permission.
- Downloading by pupils of materials or images not relevant to their studies is not allowed.

Email and Messaging

- The use of personal email accounts is not allowed at Tirelton National School.
- Pupils should not under any circumstances share their email account login details with other pupils.
- Pupils should not use school email accounts to register for online services such as social networking services.
- Pupils will use approved class email accounts only under supervision by or permission from a teacher.
- Pupils should be aware that email communications are monitored.

Pupils will not send any material that is illegal, obscene, and defamatory or that is intended to annoy or intimidate another person.

Pupils will not use personal email accounts.

Pupils should immediately report the receipt of any communication that makes them feel uncomfortable is offensive, discriminatory, threatening or bullying in nature and must not respond to any such communication.

Pupils should avoid opening emails that appear suspicious. If in doubt, pupils should ask their teacher before opening emails from unknown senders.

Social Media

The following statements apply to the use of messaging, blogging and video streaming services in Tirelton National School:

- Use of instant messaging services and apps including Snapchat, Whats Apps, G Chat etc. is not allowed in Tirelton National School.
- Use of blogs such as Word Press, Tumblr etc. is not allowed in Tirelton National School.
- Use of video streaming sites such as YouTube and Vimeo etc. is allowed with express permission from teaching staff.

Staff and pupils must not use social media and the internet in any way to harass, insult, abuse or defame pupils, their family members, staff, other members of the Tirelton National School community

Staff and pupils must not discuss personal information about pupils, staff and other members of the Tirelton National School community on social media.

Staff and pupils must not use school email addresses for setting up personal social media accounts or to communicate through such media.

Staff and pupils must not engage in activities involving social media which might bring Tirelton National School into disrepute.

Staff and pupils must not represent your personal views as those of bring Tirelton National School on any social medium.

Personal Devices

Pupils using their own technology in school should follow the rules set out in this agreement, in the same way as if they were using school equipment.

The following statements apply to the use of internet-enabled devices such as tablets, gaming devices, and digital music players in Tirelton National School:

- Pupils are only allowed to bring personal internet-enabled devices into Tirelton National School with expressed permission from staff.
- Pupils are only allowed to use personal internet-enabled devices during lessons with expressed permission from teaching staff.

Images & Video

Care should be taken when taking photographic or video images that pupils are appropriately dressed and are not participating in activities that might bring the individuals or the school into disrepute.

At Tirelton National School pupils must not take, use, share, publish or distribute images of others without their permission.

Taking photos or videos on school grounds or when participating in school activities is allowed once care is taken that no harm is done to staff or pupils of Tirelton National School.

Permission from parents or carers will be obtained before photographs of pupils are published on the school website.

Pupils must not share images, videos or other content online with the intention to harm another member of the school community regardless of whether this happens in school or outside.

Sharing explicit images and in particular explicit images of pupils and/or minors is an unacceptable and absolutely prohibited behaviour, with serious consequences and sanctions for those involved. Sharing explicit images of other pupils automatically incurs suspension as a sanction.

Cyberbullying

When using the internet pupils, parents and staff are expected to treat others with respect at all times.

Engaging in online activities with the intention to harm, harass, or embarrass another pupil or member of staff is an unacceptable and absolutely prohibited behaviour, with serious consequences and sanctions for those involved.

Measures are taken by Tirelton National School to ensure that staff and pupils are aware that bullying is defined as unwanted negative behaviour, verbal, psychological or physical, conducted by an individual or group against another person (or persons) and which is repeated over time. This definition includes cyber-bullying even when it happens outside the school or at night.

Isolated or once-off incidents of intentional negative behaviour, including a once-off offensive or hurtful text message or other private messaging, do not fall within the definition of bullying and will be dealt with, as appropriate, in accordance with the school's code of behaviour.

The prevention of cyber bullying is an integral part of the anti-bullying policy of our school.

School Websites

Pupils will be given the opportunity to publish projects, artwork or school work on the internet in accordance with clear policies and approval processes regarding the content that can be loaded to the school's website.

The website will be regularly checked to ensure that there is no content that compromises the safety, privacy, or reputation of students or staff.

The publication of student work will be coordinated by the teaching and support staff.

Tirelton National School will use only digital photographs, audio or video clips of focusing on group activities. Content focusing on individual students will only be published on the school website with parental permission.

Personal student information including home address and contact details will not be published on Tirelton National School web pages.

Tirelton National School will avoid publishing the last name of pupils in video or photograph captions published online.

Direct Communication using Internet

Teachers in the school **may choose** to use a number of tools for classroom communication.

Examples include Google Classroom, Webex, Zoom, SeeSaw, and ClassDojo. Some of these tools provide synchronous virtual meeting opportunities whereby a staff member directly speaks to the children live - e.g. through a webinar or online meeting. Parental permission is sought in advance of setting up these tools. The staff member invites pupils and their families to these meetings using a code. The following are ground rules for synchronous communication online.

- All meetings will be password protected
- All people involved in the meeting will follow the Online Etiquette Guidelines (cf Appendix A)
- An invitation to attend the Online meeting will be issued to parents' email addresses. Parents must consent to their child accessing online communication by responding to this invitation.
- Parents/guardians must also agree to monitor their child's participation in any such communication conducted on the Online Platforms.
- Two members of staff are always present when there is online face to face contact with children

Virtual Meeting Etiquette

A link will be emailed to the Parents' email address before the meeting.

This link is not to be shared with anyone else.

Recording of Virtual Meetings are not allowed.

Please think of the meeting as a face-to-face meeting and behave as if you were all present in the same room

Be aware of your surroundings: Pick a quiet room that is not a bedroom and does not have traffic passing through.

Dress appropriately

Have a plain background and avoid backlight from bright windows. Have good lighting on your face so that you can be seen at all times

Children will have microphones muted when they are not talking and only turn it on if they are asked to speak.

Be respectful as teachers and pupils are real people who are affected by words you say and write.

Only use Chat if the teacher allows it. Be respectful at all times, when using Chat.

No food allowed

Children are to stay seated and stay present

Children are not to leave the room or talk on their phones.

Be patient as this is new to a lot of people and it may take time for everyone to get used to.
